Oasis Intergenerational Tutoring is the largest older adult tutoring program in the U.S. In 2019, Oasis tutors helped 21,000 children in 630 schools in 82 districts across the country. More than 4,000 Oasis tutors volunteer in 14 different states in over 20 U.S. cities. In Missouri, we have over 1,800 tutors serving 2,500 students. Oasis Tutoring provides older adults with a unique volunteer experience to impact students in kindergarten–3rd grade through a mentoring relationship focused on developing literacy confidence, competence, and enthusiasm.
