Founded in 1982 by Marylen Mann, Oasis pioneered a holistic approach to healthy aging at a time when society did not believe in the potential of older adults. From our beginnings in St. Louis, our network of centers now stretches from coast to coast, *serving 44 states*.

The three central tenets of Oasis 40 years ago continue to be the core of our mission now: Lifelong Learning, Health & Wellness, and Civic Engagement through volunteering. The value of our mission is supported by study after study that shows: If we want society to age successfully, we must nurture our mind and body, and be part of something bigger than ourselves.

Each year Oasis provides communities across the country with over **5,500 lifelong learning** classes, **3,560 health and wellness classes**, and **more than 6,000 older adult volunteers**.

The demographics of the U.S are changing rapidly. By 2030, 20% of the nation's population will be at least 65, and within a few years this group will outnumber the country's children for the *first time in our history*.
